NAMESAKES OF CHRIST

On Palm Sunday, we heard in Paul's letter to the Philippians that all things in heaven, on earth, and under the earth must bend their knee at the name of Jesus. That name comes back in today's first reading. The Sanhedrin, whom we heard about just a few short weeks ago in the reading of the Passion, are again confronted by Jesus in his name being proclaimed by the apostles. Peter and the others refuse to bend their knee to the authority of the Sanhedrin and stop teaching in the name of Christ. In fact, they rejoice that they have been persecuted for doing so.

Do we turn to those first brave followers when we are called upon to give witness to the name of Christ in our name "Christian" day by day? When we must stand against, challenge, or confront forces that counter the gospel of justice, peace, joy, and beauty, do we give witness with no less than the Holy Spirit or do we remain silent? Do we genuinely give honor to the name of Jesus by being his namesakes in the world today?

The food and financial donations received went directly to families right here in the Newbury Park area. Thanks again for making Easter brighter for so many in our community!

Mexico Mission Trip—2010 Trip Recap

As you may know, on Monday, April 5, 2010 we left St. Julie's and traveled to Tecate, Mexico where we built six homes for families who were in great need.

Each one of these families had bought but is still paying on the small piece of ground they obtained 2-4 years ago. Their living conditions prior to our arrival consisted of a small dwelling made out of scrap lumber and garage doors. Some of the dwellings had cement floors, but most did not. The families all slept in one room and their cooking was done either outside or next to the sleeping quarters. These seven families had a total of 43 members. The parents were all employed but the average weekly salary for each family ranged from \$80-\$110 a week.

In order to get our group of 128 missionaries to Mexico and back, it cost \$225 in fees for each participant, which purchased the building materials in Mexico for each home. In addition to the fees the cost of rental vans and Mexico insurance was \$9700 not including fuel. Food donations alone totaled over \$7500.00. In all over \$51,000.00 in cash and food donations were collected.

Your gifts, donations, encouragement and prayers made it possible for the students and adults to build a relationship with the people of Mexico and serve them as Christ calls us to do. Our goal in this Mission Outreach Program is to help our youth to live out their faith and be an example in this world. Our success was dependent on parishioners and friends such as yourself who made it possible through your generosity.

As we left Mexico, I felt confident that not only were the families in Tecate provided shelter, but more importantly that the hearts of the volunteers from St. Julie's were forever changed. It is said that what we do with what we have is more important than what we have. The parish here at St. Julie's is indeed blessed to have such giving individuals. Thank you again for your generosity and for making this trip possible.

What is Alpha?

- A** anyone interested in finding out more about the Catholic faith. All adults are welcome.
- L** earning and laughter. Learn about your faith and have fun at the same time.
- P** eople meeting together. It's an opportunity to get to know others and make friends.
- H** elping one another. The small groups give you a chance to discuss issues and ask questions.
- A** ask anything. Alpha is a place where no question is seen as hostile or too simple.

Alpha is a 10-week course that presents some of the basic teachings of the Catholic faith. Participants meet once a week on Friday evenings. Each meeting consists of a meal, followed by a video. Then we break into small groups to discuss the video.

While it is primarily for the un-churched or inactive Catholic, it is also helpful for those who want to explore their faith more deeply. The talks explain the gospel clearly, in a way that is relevant for today.
