**CHRIST FORETOLD**

In Genesis, Melchizedek is described as a king who is also a priest. As this story is usually interpreted, Melchizedek's action of bringing out bread and wine and blessing it with praise to the Creator is a prophetic action. Seen as a prefigurement of the action of Jesus, he foretells to Abram the One who is to come, the Messiah. The psalm echoes this theme in the time of David the King, who praises and thanks God and proclaims the preexistence of the Christ, who is given princely power from "the day of your birth, in holy splendor." (Psalm 110:3) God has promised this to David and his descendants forever, and God will never go back on this promise.

## **“The Bishop as Teacher”**

### **The fifth in a series of seven articles on the office of the bishop by members of the Archdiocesan Theological Commission**

Most of us know that the Church uses holy chrism to anoint the newly baptized and to confer the sacrament of Confirmation. However, many of us may not be aware that the Church also uses chrism to anoint the hands of a priest and the head of a bishop on the day of their ordination. Although our next Archbishop has already been ordained bishop, it is instructive for us to reflect on the meaning of the sacramental anointing of a bishop.

Anointing with chrism is a sign that the baptized, confirmed, and ordained share a common bond. All are members of God’s People called to live as Christ in, to and for the world, each in a specific way. The Rite of Baptism proclaims, “As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet and King, so may you live always as members of his body, sharing everlasting life.” From the previous essay in this series, we learned that the bishop lives out his baptismal and ministerial vocation to be a priest like Christ by sanctifying the people of his diocese, most visibly through the celebration of the sacraments. In this essay, we reflect on the bishop’s teaching activity, specifically fulfilling the prophetic aspect of his office in the Body of Christ.

In both the Old and the New Testaments, the fundamental vocation of all prophets was not to foretell the future but to announce the presence of God, to call the people to faithfulness to God and to a life of justice and compassion. God announced to the Israelites, that through a covenant they were called to walk with God as God’s own people (Exodus 33:12 - 34:9). Later, God called other prophets to remind the people that if they strayed from the covenant they would find only unhappiness and destruction (Elijah, Elisha, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel). They reminded the Israelites of God’s undying and unconditional love (Hosea 11:1-4; 8-9) and of their duty to make that love concrete through genuine acts of justice and mercy (Micah 6:1-4; 6-8). John the Baptist’s prophetic vocation was to prepare the way for the Christ (Jn. 19-34). It is clear that the Transfiguration narratives in the Gospels (Mt. 17:1-9; Mk. 9:2-8; Lk. 9:28-36) present Jesus as the Christ, greater than all the prophets who preceded him, but like them, called to turn the attention of the people to the presence of God and God’s kingdom: “This is my beloved Son, listen to him” (Lk. 9:36). Through his teaching, his actions, and especially through his passion and death, Christ lived to its fullness the vocation of prophet. Through his resurrection, “God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names” (Phil. 2:8-9).

God has called our next Archbishop from among God’s People, to live the baptismal vocation through the uniqueness of his priestly and episcopal ordinations. In numerous ways, but especially when he presides from the cathedra (the episcopal chair) in our Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels, and proclaims and preaches the word of God, he will exercise his office as teacher and prophet from among and for the benefit of all the People of the Church of Los Angeles: “The Bishop as herald of the faith leads new followers to Christ. As their authentic teacher, that is, one invested with the authority of Christ, he proclaims to the people entrusted to him the truths of faith they are to believe and to live by. Under the light of the Holy Spirit, the Bishop explains the teachings of faith, bringing forth from the treasure house of revelation new things and old. He works to make faith yield its harvest and, like the good shepherd, he is vigilant in protecting his people from the threat of error” (*Ceremonial of Bishops*, 15).
