 "I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me."  
 - 1 Galatians 2:20

**REPENT**

"You are the man." These words, spoken to King David by the prophet Nathan in the passage just before today's first reading, were a wake-up call to David that he had done wrong in taking the wife of Uriah and having Uriah killed in battle. The story that woke David up to his own guilt was about a rich man who had many sheep, but took and slaughtered the only sheep of a poor man. David thought the man should be punished; but when Nathan made known to him that this story was about David himself, David woke up to his own sin and repented and the Lord forgave him.

Today's psalm of David reinforces for us the necessity of recognizing our own guilt and confessing it before the Lord. Then "blessed is the one whose fault is taken away, / whose sin is covered." (Psalm 32:1) God becomes our shelter and gives us back our freedom.

## **“The Bishop as Shepherd and Father of the Local Church”**

### **The sixth in a series of seven articles on the office of the bishop by members of the Archdiocesan Theological Commission**

The image of the king, as depicted in the Old Testament, includes that of a shepherd who cares for his flock (Ezekiel 34:23) and a father who protects and provides for his children (Psalm 72). In the New Testament, Christ is depicted as sitting now at the right hand of the Father and presiding over the world and all creation as priest, prophet and king (Hebrews 1:1-4). The bishop shares in this threefold office of Christ in a special way, serving the people entrusted to his care. The description of the bishop's kingly office is found in the Second Vatican Council document, *Christus Dominus*, 16. It centers on the notion that the bishop is first and foremost, and in every respect, a servant to his people. All authority that he possesses is made manifest only through service to others.

The bishop carries not the scepter of the monarch, but the crozier, or crook-shaped staff, which is a symbol of his call to act as a “pastor,” which means “shepherd.” The good shepherd lives in the midst of his people; he does not rule over them. Like Christ, the Good Shepherd (John 10:11-18), the bishop, as good shepherd, cares for each member of his flock as much as he cares for the flock as a whole. In order to be effective, he must know his sheep, and they must know him. He seeks connection and familiarity with their needs in the social circumstances in which they live, and, more generally, with the needs of the time. In this way, he will know the specific needs of his flock as a whole and of each member, so that he may consult more suitably the welfare of the faithful according to the condition of each one. He acts with the deep conviction that he is responsible to God for the souls in his care.

In the same capacity, the bishop is a true and loving father to the Christian family. As a good shepherd, he loves his flock as his own children. He serves them just as mothers and fathers care for their children, with concern for their physical, social, and spiritual needs. The church's mission and the bishop's role involve caring for the whole human person, body and soul. He is called to a special care for the poor, defending and protecting them from oppression and helping the wider church community to deliver the essentials of life to them. This service through charity extends to the poor outside the church as much as to the poor within the church. Likewise, the bishop reaches out lovingly to all those outside the church, both the separated brothers and sisters and the non-baptized, who live within the boundaries of his diocese. He seeks to facilitate ecumenism through whatever forms of outreach respond to the needs of those who comprise the larger community within the boundaries of his diocese.

The bishop also seeks to establish, facilitate and nurture the assembly of shepherds under his supervision, namely priests, deacons and lay leaders, who help him to carry out this loving, self-sacrificing service—seen in the best of human parents—to all those souls in his care. In this way, he fulfills his role as shepherd and father, to “gather and mold the whole family of his flock, that everyone, conscious of his own duties, may live and work in the communion of love” (*Christus Dominus*, 16).

The bishop is the good shepherd of his diocese, modeled after *the* Good Shepherd, Jesus Christ Himself, who knows his sheep, loves them as his own children, and cares for their every need.

Millions of toys are out there, and hundreds hit the stores each year. Toys are supposed to be fun and are an important part of any child's development. But each year, scores of kids are treated in hospital emergency departments for toy-related injuries. Choking is a particular risk for kids ages 3 or younger, because they tend to put objects in their mouths. The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) closely monitors and regulates toys.
